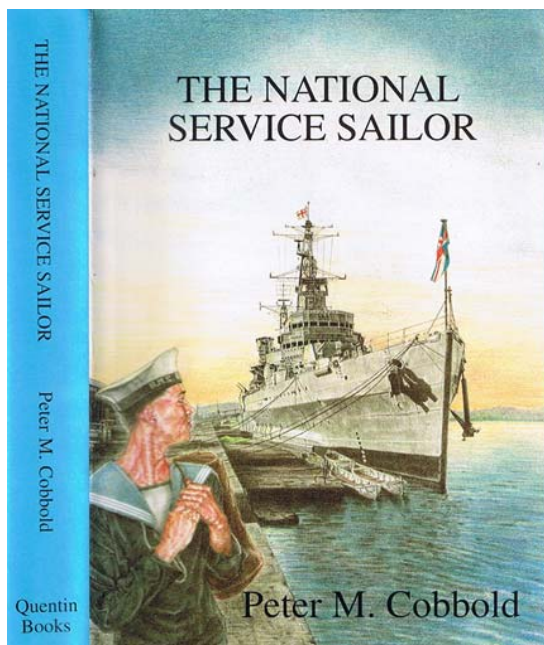

THE NATIONAL SERVICE SAILOR.

One of the first 'Cobbold' books purchased soon after the Trust's foundation in 2004 was a copy of 'The National Service Sailor' (1993) by Peter M Cobbold. There was a lot going on at that time and the book was placed affectionately on the shelf in the expectation that it would soon be retrieved for a session at the fireside. Sadly the obstacles to this worthy aspiration increased and the book remained unread...until very recently.

Perhaps partly because I had done National Service myself, albeit in the Army, but mainly because it is an intensely human first person story I identified with the Sailor and found myself thoroughly enjoying the experience. It is written in a warm, friendly and welcome style and uses well chosen simple but descriptive words laced with gentle humour.

Peter Cobbold has published numerous articles on nautical and technical subjects in, amongst others, *Motorboat and Yachting*, *Practical Boatowner* and *The East Anglian Daily Times*. This is his first full-length book. The period of National Service in the Royal Navy that it describes, left him with “itchy feet” and he joined the RNR as a seaman Petty Officer in 1959, eventually retiring, in 1972, as a Lt-Commander. Married, with two grown-up children, (his son, a college art lecturer, designed the cover of the book) Peter Cobbold now lives in a small village near Colchester. An enthusiastic yachtsman, he still patrols the East Coast, scene of many of his naval escapades.
